President

Heidelberg College invites applications and nominations for its 14th president to assume office no later than summer 2009.

A private co-educational residential college founded in 1850, affiliated with the United Church of Christ and governed by an independent board of trustees, Heidelberg effectively integrates liberal arts and professional preparation across disciplines for its 1200 traditional undergraduates, its approximately 200 non-traditional undergraduates and an equivalent number of graduate students. The faculty, staff, students, trustees and alumni are deeply committed to the College, which takes pride in increased enrollments and a growing endowment in recent years.

Located in Tiffin, a city of approximately 18,000 in Northwest Ohio, Heidelberg offers three undergraduate degrees (Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, and Bachelor of Music) with 28 majors and 29 minors, as well as three graduate degrees: Master of Business Administration, Master of Arts in Counseling, and Master of Arts in Education. Plans for a Master of Music Education and a Master of Arts in Teaching are underway.

Heidelberg College's very attractive 110 acre campus is home to 85 percent of its undergraduates. Nine buildings are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Distinctive programs include the Templeton Award winning Honors Program, the National Center for Water Quality Research, the Center for Historic and Military Archaeology, and a 50 year-old student exchange program with the University of Heidelberg in Heidelberg, Germany.

The President of Heidelberg College is the College's Chief Executive Officer. Reporting to a 30-member Board of Trustees, the President is responsible for all academic, business and administrative operations of the College. He or she will inform and then implement a nearly-completed draft of a new strategic plan, address financial challenges, continue to build strong relationships with both internal and external constituents, lead an impending \$24.5 million capital campaign and embrace shared governance, collegiality and transparency.

THE SEARCH PROCESS

Review of candidates will begin immediately and continue until a new president is appointed. Submissions received by October 6, 2008 will be assured full consideration. Applications should include a cover letter that takes into account the institutional profile (go to <http://www.academic-search.com/search.html> or www.heidelberg.edu), a résumé or *curriculum vitae*, and an annotated list of five references that notes the relationship to the candidate and includes email addresses, phone numbers, and addresses). Nominations and expressions of interest will be treated in confidence.
